By bringing a dog into Steam Plant Hotel, I agree to a \$25 fee per dog per week for all rooms. There is a maximum for two (2) dogs per room. I agree to the following statements and I understand that it is the hotel's right to exercise reasonable judgment in any relevant situation of ambiguity, emergency, or failure to comply:

- My dog is trained and I am responsible for all expenses that result from damages caused by my dog to hotel property, personnel, guests, etc.
- My dog is appropriately vaccinated.
- My dog is non-aggressive and does not pose a threat to humans or other animals in its vicinity.
- My dog will be leashed in the public areas of the hotel at all times.
- I will not leave my dog unattended in the hotel room for any period of time or in a parked vehicle at any time on hotel property.
- I will provide a kennel for my dog, to be used anytime I am not in the full view of the dog. This is not an alternative to keeping the dog with me at all times.
- My dog will not cause disturbances to hotel guests at any point during their stay. If the dog disturbs any guests I, the owner, will cover all charges that Steam Plant Hotel must reimburse a disturbed guest.

SERVICE ANIMAL FEE EXEMPTION INFORMATION

If you selected "No", what task(s) is the dog trained to accomplish?

In accordance with Washington State Law RCW 49.60.215 and WAC 162-26-130, Steam Plant Hotel welcomes trained service dogs and exempts them from dog fees. WA State Law states that failure to disclose animal training will result in the animal's disqualification from exemption. Service animals are not exempt from expenses that result from damages caused by dog to hotel property. Under ADA regulations, the Steam Plant Hotel does not recognize any comfort, therapy, or companion dogs, untrained in a specific task to be exempt from the dog-cleaning fee. Any dog that meets the qualifications of a service animal must be in the handler's control at all times to qualify for exemption.
